Keeping Healthy. With the colder weather upon us it is a timely reminder about wrapping up warm and taking good care of ourselves. If your child is unwell please keep them at home as this stops the risk of it being spread throughout the class and school.

School Sores (Impetigo): We have been informed that there are cases of School Sores. These are very contagious so please check your child for any sores. Impetigo appears as a pimple which then blisters and scabs. They increase in size rapidly and need to be treated promptly with antibiotics, either ointment or oral depending on the severity of the case. Please contact your doctor. Sores must be covered and children should be kept away from school for at least 24 hours after the first treatment with antibiotics.

Road Safety: We all have a part to play in making the road safe for our children but sadly, we often see parents who do not take this responsibility seriously. **U turns outside of the school, driving into the school driveway and dropping children off and parking on yellow lines are a danger to our students.** Please, **where possible, use the church car park and walk your children across to school.**
